



That, Mr. Ezekwenna informed Mrs. Mekamkwe that to do a case such hers may require few trips to Nigeria to gather evidence and network the governments and law enforcement quarters. The Plaintiff informed her that to report a case is quite different from pursuing a case; that for a case to be successful may mean she has to work on gathering her evidences to support her allegations and present it to the authority and convince the authority to take the case; that in one of the cases he handled which was international in nature, he had to travel to Nigeria about 3 times to gather the evidences useful to prosecute the case; that to gather evidence cost money and in some cases could cost a lot of money.

That, Mr. Ezekwenna informed Mrs. Mekamkwe that petitioning the governments and law enforcement of United States and Nigeria regarding this matter may result in heavy investigation of her allegations by the law enforcement agencies of the two countries and in that case she must make sure that everything she says is the truth. Mrs. Mekamkwe stated that she understands.

That, Mrs. Mekamkwe informed Mr. Ezekwenna that the American proofs for her story are in her possession but she does not have the Nigeria proofs such as the Police Report on the arrest of the Pastor Rita Uju Chinweuba who was arrested in Enugu by her nephew in connection with her case and her sister's case in 2007.

That, Mrs. Mekamkwe stated that she is afraid to go to Nigeria because there are other people she had businesses in Nigeria that did not go well, and she was afraid of her safety there. She also stated that her husband's relatives are after her, as well.

That, Mrs. Mekamkwe requested Mr. Ezekwenna to travel to Enugu and Lagos, Nigeria to obtain the Police Report on the arrest of Pastor Mrs. Rita Uju Chinweuba, among other things.

That, Mrs. Mekamkwe also requested the Mr. Ezekwenna to engage a lawyer in Nigeria to assist in this matter.

That, Mr. Ezekwenna accepted the offer to travel to Nigeria and reduced the agreement in writing which Mrs. Mekamkwe signed.

That, on June 30, 2007, Mr. Ezekwenna traveled to Nigeria and had meetings with Mrs. Mekamkwe's lawyer, sister and brother-in-law in Lagos. Mr. Ezekwenna accompanied by Mrs. Mekamkwe's lawyer also traveled to Special Fraud Unit of the Nigeria Police Force, and the Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) in Lagos.

That, Mr. Ezekwenna also traveled to Enugu and went to Uwani Police Station, Enugu with Mrs. Mekamkwe's lawyer to obtain the Police Report on the arrest of Pastor Mrs. Rita Chinweuba at Uwani Police Station. The process of getting the Police Report took 3 days in Enugu.

That, Mr. Ezekwenna took the police Report and examined it and found out that though Pastor Mrs. Chinwuba was arrested, the report contains some very damaging facts to Mrs. Mekamkwe's case.

That, Mr. Ezekwenna returned to New York on 16 July, 2007 and gave the Police Report to Mrs. Mekamkwe.

That, on reading the Police Report, Mrs. Mekamkwe observed that though the alleged fraudster (Pastor) was arrested, the Police Report also contained some damaging information on illegal activities Mrs. Mekamkwe's nephew and other family members were engaged-in, in Enugu, Nigeria.

About the same time a Special Agent from FBI, New York called one of Mrs. Mekamkwe relatives regarding petition the office received.

That, at about the same time, a police officer from Interpol Division of the Nigeria Police Force (a Superintendent of Police) called Mrs. Patricia Mekamkwe from Lagos, Nigeria regarding her petition they received, and requested for additional information with view to proceed to invite/arrest Pastor Mrs. Chinweuba in Enugu.

That, Mrs. Mekamkwe panicked and stated that from the Police Report and the look of things, it appears that pursuing this case will open a lot of her personal and family ugly secrets if and when Pastor Mrs. Chinweuba fights back and open up on their business and other things she (Pastor Mrs. Chinweuba) had known about her (Mrs. Mekamkwe). Mrs. Mekamkwe stated that she is worried that Pastor Mrs. Chinweuba may reveal certain information about herself and her relatives to Nigeria Police and she was also worried the implication if Nigeria and United States law enforcement share and compare notes.

That, on September 25, 2007, Mr. Ezekwenna saw Mrs. Mekamkwe at Prestige African and Caribbean Market (cum beer parlor) in Bronx, New York when she addressed a gathering of about 30 to 40 Nigerian community that assembled there to hang out, drink beer, liquor and engage in gossips. She complained to the gathering alleging that Mr. Lemmy Chigbo Chinweuba and his wife Pastor Mrs. Rita Uju Chinweuba defrauded her in so many ways. At the end of her presentation to the gathering, she requested them to assist her in spreading the news to other people so people will know the kind of person Mr. and Mrs. Chinweuba are and to put pressure on them to recover her money.

But before Mrs. Mekamkwe finished her presentation, Mr. Chinweuba who was also present replied in a loud tone of voice that Mrs. Mekamkwe was his girlfriend and that he does not want to discuss explicit sexual escapades he had with his girlfriend to the public gathering, and walked away.

That, Mr. Ezekwenna later called Mrs. Mekamkwe and asked her why she went to tell her story at the African Market and beer parlor which is a public gossip center when she had reported the matter to the law enforcement of United States and Nigeria and knows very well that investigation had begun. Mr. Ezekwenna pointed some few inconsistencies in

her sworn petitions which she sent to the Presidents and law enforcement agencies in United States and Nigeria and the story she presented at the Africans Market/beer parlor and told her that her actions will damage her case.

That, Mr. Ezekwenna told Mrs. Mekamkwe that some parts of her presentation were outright falsehood and pointed some of them to her, including when upon inquiry from the gathering she told them that she has not reported the matter to any law enforcement.

That, Mrs. Mekamkwe replied that she does not want to tell them everything in the African market. She also stated that one Nigerian lawyer based in New York advised her to take her case to the African market. At that moment, Mr. Ezekwenna told Mrs. Mekamkwe that she may have wounded her case tremendously by her actions and lies.

That, when Mr. Ezekwenna demanded for the payment for his trip to Nigeria and services rendered, Mrs. Mekamkwe refused, but instead, started using all manner of threats to intimidate him.

That, Mrs. Mekamkwe had reportedly bragged to Mr. Ezekwenna that a Nigerian lawyer based in New York, had promised to connect her to Nigeria Attorney-General of the Federation, the head of Nigeria Economic and Financial Crimes Commission (EFCC) and the Nigeria Inspector-General of Police to kill any case against her and her relatives in Nigeria, as well as assist her to confuse the United States law enforcement if anyone including Mr. Ezekwenna decide to make case with her.

That, Mrs. Mekamkwe reportedly had taken some people, including New York City Government caseworkers to Mr. Ezekwenna's office to brag about their connections in the New York City law enforcement and Nigeria Police Force in an attempt to intimidate him. One of the individuals she took to Mr. Ezekwenna's office is a Child Welfare Caseworker who she falsely introduced as New York City Fraud Investigator.

That, on January 8, 2008, Mr. Ezekwenna received a letter from The Rosenthal Law Firm, PC stating that Mrs. Patricia Mekamkwe informed them that she went to him for services which were not carried out. The letter also threatening, among other things, to sue Mr. Ezekwenna if he makes any attempt to collect money for his services. The letter was signed by Douglas Rosenthal for; The Rosenthal Law Firm, PC.

That, based on content of the letter Mrs. Patricia Mekamkwe wrote to Mr. Ezekwenna via The Rosenthal Law Firm, PC, signed by Douglas Rosenthal, it therefore become very clear that she has been playing pranks and does not intend to pay services rendered to her.

After these attempts to intimidate Mr. Ezekwenna, and based on other information obtained from Mrs. Mekamkwe, Mr. Ezekwenna decided to investigate and in the process found disturbing pattern of rots, lies, treachery, dishonesty, deceits, deceptions and possible criminalities, some of which are laid out below:

“The plaintiff had since discovered some parts of the Defendant’s sworn statements which she mailed to the governments and law enforcement agencies in Nigeria and United States that appear to be false. Example: The defendant informed the plaintiff that the crux of her allegations against Mr. and Mrs. Chinweuba are as follows: she thought Pastor Mrs. Rita Uju Chinweuba sees visions and prays for people and destroys evil spirits that prevent people from getting good luck, and answers to their prayers. The defendant also informed the plaintiff that she does not have a male child and she thought Pastor Mrs. Rita Uju Chinweuba has power to pray for her to conceive and bear male child/children. However, when she found out that Mr. and Pastor Mrs. Chinweuba has 5 children and all of them males, she decided to seek a male child through dating Mr. Chinweuba with hope she will get pregnant by him and bear male child as well. At that moment she willingly went along with every proposal Mr. and Pastor Mrs. Chinweuba put to her and gave them everything they asked for. The defendant informed plaintiff that trouble started when her divorced older sister started dating Mr. Chineuba as well and when she eventually lost Mr. Chinweuba to her older sister, she got angry and decided to deal with both Mr. and Pastor Mrs. Chinweuba to recover every money and everything she gave to them”.

“On looking back, the Plaintiff states that the defendant had threatened at one time that she could frame up anybody with spurious allegations and blackmail if she does not get her way. She cited what she did to one man (name blanked) in New York City as an example. She stated that she called the FBI and reported the fraud he was doing when all her efforts to get him to marry her daughter failed. The Defendant told the plaintiff that even though the man (name blanked) was doing the fraud with Defendant’s daughter, it is only he that was arrested, spend months in federal detention, and only he is in trouble. This statement had been collaborated by others”.

“In about middle of June 2007, the defendant informed the Plaintiff that a Nigerian Yoruba male tenant residing in illegal basement apartment in her house at 2738 Fenton Avenue, Bronx, New York 10469 refused to pay his rent and that she was looking for someone to go and threaten him with a gun so he would move out of her house”.

“Upon the Plaintiff’s return from Nigeria on July 16, 2007, the defendant informed him that she framed the male tenant with false allegation of physically attacking her and got him arrested by the New York Police and that was how she got him to move out quickly”.

(Based on these, and refusing to be intimidated, Mr. Ezekwenna sought legal counsel and instituted civil action against Mrs. Mekamkwe at Enugu, Nigeria which is one of the locations key services were rendered).
